Treasurer's Report 2017

The closing 2016 balance for the Czech and Slovak Club was \$13,402.34, which was \$1087 more than the January 2016 beginning balance. We received 36% of our income from dues, 35% from the Ethnic Festival, 16% from the Slavic Fest, 9% from other sales and 4% from grants and donations. The major expenses were the Svatý Mikuláš party, scholarships, the Consul General's visit as well as festival fees and supplies.

During her time in Kansas City she visited and toured the Truman Presidential Library in Independence, Missouri, and placed a memorial wreath with the assistance of the Van Horn High School ROTC Cadet Corps at the gravesite of President Harry S. Truman and met with Mr. Kurt Graham, Director of the Library. She toured The National WWI Museum and Memorial and met with Dr. Matt Naylor, President/CEO. She toured the University of Missouri, Kansas City, Center for International Academic Programs, Olson Performing Arts Center, the Kauffman Center for the Performing Arts, and the Buttonwood Art Space.

EEC Scholarship for Graduating Seniors

The KC Ethnic Enrichment Commission offers a John Thomas & Carol C. Duncan Scholarship. The scholarship is named in honor of John Thomas and Carol C. Duncan, two of the founders of the Ethnic Enrichment Commission. The Duncans have always been very involved in their neighborhood, their ethnic community, and the Ethnic Enrichment Commission. As such, the requirements reflect a high level of involvement on the part of the applicant. The applicant must be a graduating high school senior who will be attending college in the fall of 2017, must be recommended by a commissioner, and must be the only candidate from his or her country for this scholarship year. In addition to completing the application cover sheet, the applicant must compose an essay, enclose a letter from the applicant's country's commissioner, and include a transcript. The Annual Meeting of the Honorary Consuls of the Slovak Republic in the U.S. was held Friday December 9th at the Embassy of the Slovak Republic in Washington, D.C. Topics covered were: The EU Beyond the Beltway; Slovak Republic Foreign Policy Priorities with the new US Administration; Cultural and Public Diplomacy; Consular Affairs; Trade, Entrepreneurship and Innovation Priorities. A Slovak Professionals Networking event was held on Saturday December 10th at the Embassy which focused on the areas of education, science and research and entrepreneurship endeavors currently evolving in the Slovak Republic. A number of young start-up and tech savvy professionals in the Washington DC area in addition to the Honorary Consuls, Embassy and New York Consulate officers attended the event with presentations being made by entrepreneurs/research/ academic leaders in the Slovak Republic. Coming July 2017 to Buttonwood ARTspace

An Exhibition Commemorating the 75th Anniversary of the Lidice Tragedy

The exhibition tells the story of the circumstances resulting in the destruction of Lidice, a village in Central Bohemia approximately 27km northwest of Prague. The tragedy occurred on June 10, 1942.

That day, Nazi leaders ordered the complete destruction of Lidice, in reprisal for the assassination of Reich Protector Reinhard Heydrich in the late spring of 1942. Every adult male and fifty-two women were killed. All surviving women and children were then deported to concentration camps, or if found suitable to be "Germanized," sent to the greater Reich.

The Nazi's then proudly proclaimed that the village of Lidice, its residents, and its very name, were now forever blotted from memory. The Lidice tragedy became a symbol of the suffering of the innocent civilian population, not only in the Czech Republic (then Czechoslovakia) but throughout the world.
